#### Timber Plantation -

- Plantation of Eucalyptus and/or Acacia for production of plantation timber for production of:
  - Plywood MDF Particle Board
  - $\circ$  Other Wood Panel  $\circ$  Pulp & Paper  $\circ$  Charcoal

#### Agriculture Investment Zone

- Development of farming land along with requisite support facilities for production of:
  - o Staple Crops & Cereals: Rice, Maize/Corn, Wheat, Cassava, Yum
  - Vegetables: Green peas & beans, Potato, Onion, Bottle Gourd, Pumpkin, Bitter gourd, Okra, Carrots, Tomato, Cauliflowers, Cabbage, Broccoli, Asparagus, Spinach
  - Fruits: Pineapple, Banana, Orange, Papaya, Guava, Coconut, Water melon, Musk Melon, Lemon, Avocado
  - o Commercial Crops: Oil Palm, Rubber, Coffee, Cocoa, Sugarcane
  - breeding and processing (beef, sheep, pigs, poultry, etc.)

#### Wood Processing Zone

• This zone will be focusing on processing of plantation timbers as well as timber from natural forests in surrounding region.

#### Agri Processing Zone -

 This zone will focus on storage, controlled warehousing and processing of produces from the Agriculture Investment Zone. The aim of zone would be to reduce the import of food items in the country and produce high quality food products for exports to Europe and West Africa.
